GENERAL BUSINESS:

Run Reports: Normal practice was for the raffle winner to write the run report, but since there was no raffle at the "Parrots in Paradise" run – we did not have a run report.

It was suggested that we place an "X" on one run sheet, and that person will write the run report. After discussion this suggestion was subsequently moved by Rob Dix and seconded by Ron Byrnes – *Carried*.

Run Attendances: There was some discussion regarding attendances at our runs, with reference to our last 2 runs. Both of these (Lakeside and Parrots) involved additional entrance fees, and it was thought this may have been a factor.

It was generally agreed that we would try to space out runs that involved additional costs and not have them close together. Julie Bloomfield advised that their next proposed run would involve a nominal (gold coin) donation. This was deemed to be OK.

Virgin Blue Run: Ron Byrnes has been approached by CHACC to organise a run to Virgin Blue. Since our last run there was so successful and enjoyed by all members, he wanted to discuss the options. He had suggested that we continue with our run there in 2010, but then we allow CHACC to go the following year. Our main objective should be to maintain this destination as a "special" run for our club and to

skip a year would stop it becoming just another run. It was agreed that Ron go ahead and organise the run for CHACC, but that attendance be strictly limited so that all attendees enjoy the experience.

Australia Day Run: Michelle Dix advised that QHMC organise an excellent run on Australia Day and requested an estimate of numbers interested. It was decided to finalise arrangements at our next meeting. She also mentioned a "Steam Run" next year in April at Maitland for those members interested in steam trains as well as cars, as the run caters for both types of enthusiasts.

Next Function will be our XMAS PARTY at Caboolture RSL on 12th December. We need at least 10 more members (5 couples) to come along to make up the numbers we booked for. All those who raised their hands to say they would go – please contact Julie Walters or Alex Gallacher, if you have not already done so !!

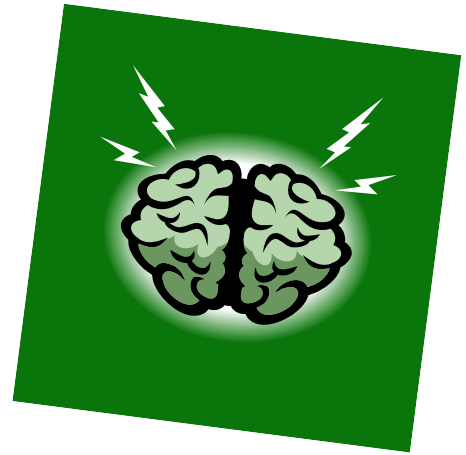
Another lot of "Teasers" - Song Lines

So the preacher grabs him and dunks him in the water. He pulls him up and asks the drunk, 'Brother have you found Jesus?'

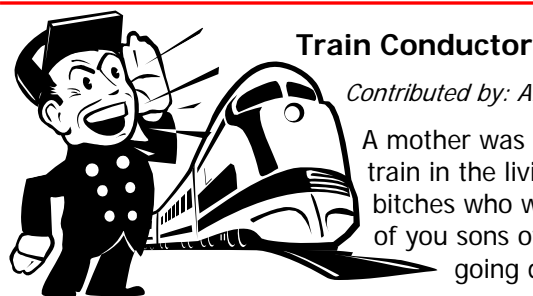
The drunk replies, 'No, OI haven't found Jesus.'

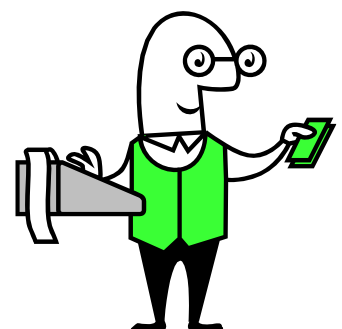
